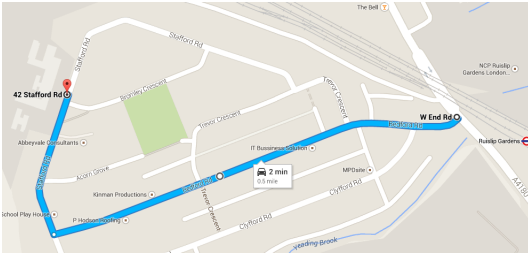
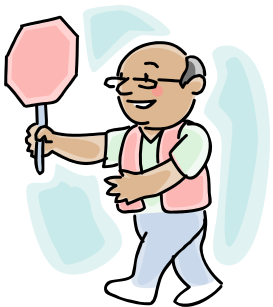

Voluntary One Way

We wish to encourage a voluntary one way system in the roads around the school. We ask that all parents and carers drive **up Bedford Road** towards the school (as shown in blue) and drive **away from the school via Stafford Road** (turning left on to Trevor Crescent and left onto Bedford Road or turning right onto Bromley Crescent before joining Bedford Road)



Zebra Crossing

Safe use of the Zebra Crossing must be adhered to at all times. This will not only maintain individual safety but will also ensure the smooth running of the drop off zone and the voluntary one way system. All drivers **MUST** stop as required to allow for safe crossing. Parents must ensure children are not racing on ahead and using the crossing unsupervised. We hope to have a crossing patrol officer appointed in the due course.

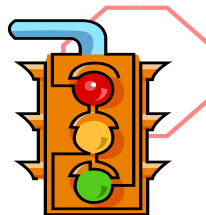


Drop Off Zone KS2 (Years 3—6 ONLY) Code of Practice

1. KS2 (Years 3—6) children ONLY may use the Zone
2. Adults remain in their vehicle
3. Children may not access the car boot
4. Children must exit from left car door
5. Children use reception pathway to gain entry to playground. Y5 direct to classroom

Drop Off Zone Road Safety Rules

1. Entry to zone by left hand turn
2. Exit from zone by left hand turn
3. 5mph speed limit
4. Cars wait on orange area, children walk on green area
5. Follow the one way system around the estate

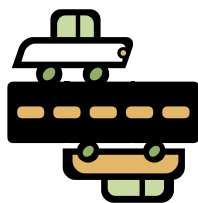

School Travel Plan



At Ruislip Gardens we take very seriously the responsibility to keep our pupils safe. This extends to safe arrival of children at school and departure from school at the end of the day.

We fulfill our obligation by completing a School Travel Plan document which includes our commitment to encourage road safety, eco-travel to and from school and a series of challenges to motivate us to improve.

Whilst we are not able to be fully responsible for children at these times we wish to make requests of our community to take responsible steps towards ensuring road safety around the school.

This will rely on good will, team spirit and a desire to work towards a common goal.

Drop Off Zone From Tues 8th July 2014

The Drop Off Zone is for KS2 children ONLY. No adult may leave their vehicle in the Zone. Entry to the zone is made by turning left into it and exiting with a left turn. The Code of Practice (rear of booklet) must be followed by users.

Zig-Zags and Yellow Lines

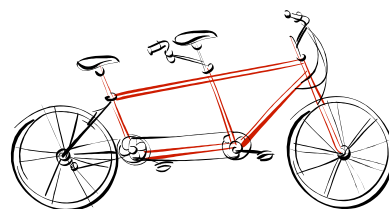
There should be NO parking or dropping or collecting of children on the zig-zag markings between 8-10am and 2:30-4:30pm. There should be no parking on the double yellow lines at any time. This is essential in maintaining the safety of our pupils.

Car Sharing

In our Travel Plan we aim to increase the number of pupils travelling to school as part of a car-share arrangement by 5%. We ask that you revisit our travel arrangements periodically and take steps to take part in some car-sharing activity if walking or riding is not an option.

General Road Safety

General road safety must be adhered to, this includes items above but also refraining from parking over driveway, not dropping children in the middle of the road and maintaining low driving speeds (20 mph) in the roads around the school.



Walk to School

We are committed to encouraging as many children to walk or ride to school as possible. We take part in the Walk to School Initiative in the Borough which offers many incentives to participate in this activity.

Park and Stride

If you don't have the time to walk all the way and your friends are not able to car share, please consider trying out the 'park and stride' initiative. You could park in roads leading up to the school estate and walk for the final part of your journey.

Riding & Scooting

We encourage children to ride or scoot to school and have improved facilities to house equipment on site. We have a locked bike shelter and scooter pods in the playground areas. We take part in many initiatives designed to encourage riding and scooting to school.

Respect our Neighbours

Please refrain from inconsiderate parking. Our neighbours should be respected and be able to achieve free, safe access to their own property. Please note that parking over-hanging dropped kerbs is a violation of parking regulations and can warrant a parking ticket.
